AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONIES
Section 284 OF THE HIGHWAY LAW

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Farmington, of Ontario County, State of New York and the undersigned members of the Town Board. **For** the fiscal year of **2022** it is expected that the Town will receive approximately **\$ 552,214** through State Aid programs as well as any VLT monies. **For** the fiscal year of **2022** it is expected that the Highway Accounts will receive approximately **\$ 439,763** from taxes levied within the Town, approximately **\$ 222,619** in revenues from equipment rentals, reimbursement for snow and ice removal and other charges for services and as reimbursements from other municipal accounts for services performed with Highway Department personnel and equipment. **For** the fiscal year of **2022**, the Town Board agrees to reappropriate the monies that remain unencumbered from the last fiscal year to the Highway Accounts for this fiscal year.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, we agree that moneys levied and collected in the Town for the repair and improvement of highways, the revenues from equipment rentals, reimbursement for snow and ice removal and other charges for services, the reappropriated funds, and the CHIPS and other State Aid for highways, shall be expended as follows:

- 1A. GENERAL MAINTENANCE & REPAIRS** - The sum of \$ **840,914.88** shall be set aside to be expended for basic work and general maintenance and repairs upon **94.62** miles of Town highways, including surface treatments, sluices, drainage ditches, culverts and bridges, highway, tree and brush removal, board walks, sidewalks that are the responsibility of the Town, emergency activities as such are authorized by the Town Board, and other activities involved with the care, upkeep and maintenance of highways and bridges of the Town.
- 1B. PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS - HIGHWAYS** - The sum of \$ **553,768.12** shall be set aside to be expended for the permanent improvements of Town highways. The Town highways that are intended to be improved include:
- a) On the highway known as **Limestone Lane** commencing at **Meadow Brook Lane** and leading to **a dead end**, consisting of **5,333 square yards**.
EST. COST: \$20,215.33 **Fibermat/Cape seal**
 - b) On the highway known as **Barberry Lane** commencing at **Bowerman Road** and leading to **Elder Drive**, consisting of **1,600** square yards.
EST. COST: \$ 5,708.17 **Fibermat/Cape seal**
 - c) On the highway known as **Elder Drive** commencing at **Allen Padgham Road** and leading to **Holly Lane**, consisting of **4,622** square yards.
EST. COST: \$18,876.38 **Fibermant/Cape seal**
 - d) On the highway known as **Holly Lane** commencing at **Elder Drive** and leading to **Mulberry Drive**, consisting of **3,022** square yards.
EST. COST: \$11,860.99 **Fibermat/Cape seal**

- e) On the highway known as Hawthorne Circle commencing at Mulberry Drive and leading to a Cul-de-sac, consisting of 3,911 square yards.

- f) On the highway known as Mulberry Drive commencing at Elder Drive and leading to a Cul-de-sac, consisting of 10,667 square yards.
EST. COST: \$40,698.80 Fibermat/Capeseal
- g) On the highway known as Amanda Place commencing at Mulberry Drive and leading to Marcus Way, consisting of 767 square yards.
EST. COST: \$1,648.33 Fibermat/Capeseal
- h) On the highway known as Marcus Way commencing at Amanda Place and leading to a Cul-de-sac (each end), consisting of 6,644 square yards.
EST. COST: \$ 14,285.56 Fibermat/Capeseal
- i) On the highway known as Loomis Road commencing at Hook Road and leading to State Route 332, a distance of 5,808 Feet.
EST. COST: \$120,699.99 CHIPS PROJECT
